We have reached the end of the academic year and I know that the last 4 months have been a time of great challenge. Particularly for Year 11 students who were unable to fulfill their right of passage, and unlike every year group before them, were not able to sit their examinations.

Exam boards and Ofqual have devised a way of standardising grades across all schools and colleges using expected grades, previous school results and the prior attainment of students. This is to ensure the grades are as fair as possible. The teachers at St Martin's have used all available evidence of each student's knowledge, skills and abilities to inform professional judgements.

The grades will be available on **20 August 2020** and your daughter will receive a letter inviting her into school for a socially distanced personal collection according to prearranged times. You will receive this letter in early August detailing specific times and how to enrol into St Martin's 6th Form.
