Dear Families

I hope you are well and ready for the Easter break. It is hard to believe that I am writing to you to say that we will be on holiday as from the end of today. The time has flown since we welcomed out students back to school on 8 March and we have had a busy and productive 4 weeks. School will reopen for the final term of the academic year at the normal time on **Monday 19 April 2021**.

This will be a long letter so please stay with me to the end. I will set out each new item under a subheading to make it easier to follow.

Free school meals

If your child is eligible for free school meals, you will receive a message with an e-code from our usual provider, Wonde. Please claim your code as soon as possible. You will receive £30 for two weeks for each eligible child.

Home testing

The home testing is going well. However, we have distributed more test kits than we are receiving results. If you have agreed to participate in the home testing, please ensure that your child tests twice a week and then reports the results. This can be done quickly and easily via the covid-19 home testing section on our website. Your child can get additional test kits from our testing centre once they have used and reported on all their tests.

Contact Tracing

The government made the following statement regarding contact tracing over the Easter holiday. 'Schools continue to play an important role in contact tracing and the national effort to limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). We recognise the challenges of this responsibility during holidays and would like to thank everyone for their continued support. Asking establishments to provide contact tracing support is a key part of the test and trace process, as schools hold the data about close contacts and pupil contact details.'

'We will continue to keep these arrangements under review and will continue to try to reduce the burden on staff. We need to ask schools and further education providers to continue with contact tracing over Easter, similar to the arrangements over Christmas.'

- Staff, students, parents and carers only need to inform the school of a positive case where
 they developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in their education setting. The school
 will assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have
 been infectious whilst in school.
- Where students or staff test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) during the holidays, having
 developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in an education setting, the school is
 not required to take any action. Staff, students, parents and carers should follow contact
 tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.



• Staff do not need to be available for contact tracing duties beyond the first 6 days of the Easter holidays, at which point all positive cases should be dealt with through NHS Test and Trace. This means that where a school ends face-to-face education on Wednesday 31 March, there will be no need to remain on-call after Tuesday 6 April.

If the case meets the criteria in bullet point 1, which is, you have tested positive within the first 48 hours of being in school, use the dedicated St Martin's coronavirus email address and I will contact you. Alternatively you can call the coronavirus dedicated mobile Number 07753 498688 However, email is preferable covid@stmartins.academy Making contact with the school is so that we can carry out any track and trace related to any school close contacts. You will also have to follow the NHS guidance in relation to tests and self isolation.

Outside the 48 hours of the last date of being in school, you and families of students testing positive would follow the normal procedure contacting NHS online.

You will need to be informed should a positive test or isolation run into the return date after the Easter holiday which is Monday 19 April.

Shielding

The government has paused the shielding notice from today, 31 March. We look forward to welcoming back staff and students who were following the shielding guidance. Our risk assessment will be updated to reflect this. If you have any concerns for your child with regards to her return, please contact the school.
